

**AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW § 57107 TO CHAPTER 57 OF  
TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO  
REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND  
TAXATION TO ESTABLISH AN EXCEPTIONS  
PROCESS FOR HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS AND  
UNACCOMPANIED HOMELESS YOUTH OBTAINING  
A GUAM IDENTIFICATION CARD; AND TO FURTHER  
CITING THIS ACT AS THE “*HOMELESS YOUTH AND  
FAMILIES IDENTIFICATION ACT.*”**

1           **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2           **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds  
3 that it is a legitimate government interest to address the island’s growing homeless  
4 population. According to preliminary data from the Guam Homeless Coalition’s  
5 (GHC) 2019 Point-in-Time Count, the number of homeless households on Guam

1 grew from 13.2% to 16% and the number of people whose primary nighttime  
2 residence is not designed to accommodate regular sleeping increased from seven  
3 hundred twenty-seven (727) in 2018 to seven hundred sixty-five (765) in 2019.

4 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that individuals who are homeless are  
5 often without personal identification documents as the transient and unstable nature  
6 of homelessness increases the likelihood of such documents getting stolen or lost.  
7 Based on the GHC’s most recent Point-in-Time Count Report, the number of  
8 responses citing “no identification as a barrier to employment” doubled between  
9 2017 and 2018. While identification is necessary for obtaining employment or  
10 certain public benefits, fees for acquiring or replacing personal identification  
11 documents are often prohibitive to a homeless individual.

12 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* therefore finds that removing barriers that prevent  
13 homeless individuals from obtaining identification documents may enable these  
14 individuals to achieve greater financial stability and a permanent home.

15 **Section 2.** A new § 57107 is hereby *added* to Chapter 57 of Title 10, Guam  
16 Code Annotated, to read:

17 **“§ 57107. Guam Identification Card for Homeless Individuals**  
18 **and Unaccompanied Homeless Youth.**

19 The Department of Revenue and Taxation *shall* establish an exceptions  
20 process for a person who is homeless or is an unaccompanied homeless youth  
21 to apply for a Guam Identification Card and to waive any fees associated with  
22 obtaining the identification card; provided further, that said process *shall*  
23 allow for a person who is homeless or is an unaccompanied homeless youth  
24 to submit proof of residency by providing documentation satisfactory to the  
25 Department of Revenue and Taxation from a homeless, social service, or other  
26 public assistance provider on Guam. For the purposes of this Section, the term  
27 *homeless, shall* mean a person as defined by the *Stewart B. McKinney*

1            *Homeless Assistance Act of 1987*, § 103(a), 42 U.S.C. § 11302(a), as amended  
2            from time to time, and the term *unaccompanied homeless youth*, shall mean a  
3            person twenty-four (24) years of age or younger who is not in the physical  
4            custody or care of a parent or legal guardian and who lacks a fixed, regular,  
5            and adequate nighttime residence.”

6            **Section 3.** The exceptions process *shall* be established within One Hundred  
7            Eighty (180) calendar days from the date of enactment.
