Re: Veto of Bill 259-35 (COR), "An Act to Amend § 13106 and Add a New § 13106.1 to Chapter 13 of Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, Relative to Permanent and Temporary Vacancies in the Municipal Offices of Mayor and Vice Mayor; And to Amend §§ 40110, 40124, and 40127 of Article 1, Chapter 40, Division 4, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, Relative to Filling Vacancies of Mayors, the Establishment of a Municipal Planning Council (MPC) Within Each District of Guam, and Filling Vacancies in the MPC"

Dear Madame Speaker:

I agree with your legislative counsel and I am therefore exercising my executive responsibility to veto Bill 259-35. There are provisions of this bill that encroach upon the core functions of the Executive branch. And I am unwilling to sign any legislation into law that compromises the delicate balance between the three branches of government.

For nearly four months now, the village of Yona has been able to address the needs of its people with the help of the Mayors' Council of Guam. And although it has done so without the physical presence of a mayor, this is a unique issue that can be addressed. Bill 259-35 is the Legislature's attempt to address this issue. While I understand the desire to do the right thing, the right thing must also be done the right way. That is the central reason for this veto.

In fact, prior to 2013, Guam's laws provided a sound and organic process towards filling vacancies in the municipal offices of Mayor and Vice Mayor. This process was used several times and







AN ACT TO *AMEND* § 13106 AND *ADD* A NEW § 13106.1 TO CHAPTER 13 OF TITLE 3, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO PERMANENT AND TEMPORARY VACANCIES IN THE MUNICIPAL OFFICES OF MAYOR AND VICE MAYOR; AND TO *AMEND* §§ 40110, 40124, AND 40127 OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 40, DIVISION 4, TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO FILLING VACANCIES OF MAYORS, THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A MUNICIPAL PLANNING COUNCIL (MPC) WITHIN EACH DISTRICT OF GUAM, AND FILLING VACANCIES IN THE MPC.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1.** § 13106 of Chapter 13, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, is
3 *amended* to read:

4 **“§ 13106. Events Causing a Permanent Vacancy in the**
5 **Municipal Offices of Mayor and Vice Mayor.**

6 The municipal offices of Mayor and Vice Mayor become vacant on the
7 happening of any of the following events:

8 (a) death of the incumbent;

9 (b) declaration of mental incompetence by a final judgment or
10 final order of a court of competent jurisdiction;

11 (c) resignation from office;

12 (d) refusal or failure to assume office;

13 (e) the decision of a competent tribunal declaring void his or
14 her election;

15 (f) conviction of a felony, or of a crime involving moral
16 turpitude;

17 (g) his or her change of residence from the municipality in
18 which he or she was elected;

19 (h) when an incumbent is incapacitated because of illness and
20 unable to continue for the remainder of the term to which he or she was
21 elected;

22 (i) when an incumbent has sought and won election to another
23 office and assumed the new office, constituting voluntary
24 relinquishment of the original office; or

1 (j) if the results of a recall election, in accordance with § 1121
2 of Chapter 1, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated, are in favor of the removal
3 of the incumbent.

4 The occurrence of any event under Subsections (a) through (j), with
5 respect to a person or persons elected to office, after the election but before
6 the term of office is to commence, constitutes a vacancy on the date the term
7 commences, *unless* the person or persons so elected is the incumbent, in which
8 case, the vacancy occurs on the date of such event.”

9 **Section 2.** A new § 13106.1 is hereby *added* to Chapter 13 of Title 3, Guam
10 Code Annotated, to read:

11 **“§ 13106.1. Temporary Vacancy.**

12 In the absence of a Vice Mayor, if a Mayor is temporarily unable, as
13 determined by the Municipal Planning Council of the affected municipality,
14 to perform his or her duties under 5 GCA § 40112 for more than thirty (30)
15 consecutive calendar days due to any circumstance not described in § 13106
16 of this Chapter or 5 GCA § 40110(b), the Municipal Planning Council of the
17 affected municipality *shall* appoint an Acting Mayor with the advice and
18 consent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*. Upon legislative confirmation, the Acting
19 Mayor *shall* serve until the duly elected Mayor can return to his or her official
20 duties, the position is declared permanently vacant, or a new Mayor is duly
21 elected by the people of the affected municipality in an election.”

22 **Section 3.** § 40110 of Article 1, Chapter 40, Division 4, Title 5, Guam Code
23 Annotated, is *amended* to read:

24 **“§ 40110. Permanent Vacancies.**

25 (a) Vice Mayors. A vacancy in the office of the Vice Mayor *less than*
26 two hundred forty (240) days before the date of the next general election for

1 Mayors and Vice Mayors *shall* be filled for the unexpired term by a majority
2 vote of the Municipal Planning Council of the municipality in which the
3 vacancy occurs, subject to the advice and consent of *I Liheslatura* (the
4 Legislature).

5 (b) Mayors. If by reason of death, resignation, removal from office,
6 inability or failure to perform, as determined by the Guam Election
7 Commission, there *shall* be a vacancy in the office of the Mayor *less than* two
8 hundred forty (240) days before the date of the next general election for
9 Mayors and Vice Mayors:

10 (1) it *shall* be filled by the Vice Mayor in a municipality where
11 there is a Vice Mayor, and there *shall* be a vacancy in the position of
12 Vice Mayor until the end of the term; or

13 (2) if there is no Vice Mayor and the vacancy is *less than* two
14 hundred forty (240) days before the date of the next general election for
15 Mayors and Vice Mayors, the vacancy for the remaining term *shall* be
16 filled by a majority vote of the Municipal Planning Council of the
17 municipality in which the vacancy occurs, subject to the advice and
18 consent of *I Liheslatura* (the Legislature); or

19 (3) if the Municipal Planning Council is not established within
20 the municipality, the Executive Director of the Mayors Council of
21 Guam *shall* be appointed to serve as the Acting Mayor of said
22 municipality for up to ninety (90) calendar days. The Acting Mayor
23 *shall* nominate members to establish the Municipal Planning Council
24 of said municipality who *shall* be approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote
25 of the Mayors Council of Guam.”

1 **Section 4.** § 40124 of Article 1, Chapter 40, Division 4, Title 5, Guam Code
2 Annotated, is *amended* to read:

3 **“§ 40124. Municipal Planning Council: Establishment.**

4 There is established a Municipal Planning Council within each of the
5 districts of Guam.

6 (a) The Mayor, upon taking office, *shall* select and appoint a
7 Municipal Planning Council (MPC) within thirty-five (35) calendar
8 days after taking office.

9 (b) If the MPC is not established by the Mayor of said
10 municipality pursuant to Subsection (a) of this Section, the Mayor *shall*
11 submit a memorandum to the Mayors Council of Guam (MCOG) and *I*
12 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* providing the reasons for his or her failure to
13 comply with Subsection (a) of this Section. The MCOG may, in its
14 discretion, provide an additional thirty (30) calendar days to comply
15 with Subsection (a) of this Section.

16 (c) If the MPC is not established within one hundred twenty-
17 five (125) days of the Mayor taking office, the Executive Director of
18 the MCOG *shall* appoint the members of the MPC who *shall* be
19 approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of MCOG. The Executive Director
20 *shall* transmit the names of the approved members of the MPC to the
21 Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and *I Maga'hågan Guåhan.*”

22 **Section 5.** § 40127 of Article 1, Chapter 40, Division 4, Title 5, Guam Code
23 Annotated, is *amended* to read:

24 **“§ 40127. Municipal Planning Council: Vacancy.**

25 In case of a vacancy in the Municipal Planning Council (MPC) by
26 reason of death, resignation or incapacity, said vacancy *shall* be filled by:

1 (a) appointment of the Mayor of said municipality, within
2 ninety (90) calendar days; or

3 (b) if there is a vacancy in the Office of the Mayor of said
4 municipality, the vacancy in the MPC *shall* be filled in accordance with
5 § 40124(c) of this Chapter.”

6 **Section 6. Effective Date.** This Act *shall* be effective upon enactment.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. § 13106 of Chapter 13, Title 3, Guam Code Annotated is amended to read:

**3 “§ 13106. Events Causing a Permanent Vacancy in the Municipal Offices of Mayor
4 and Vice Mayor.**

**5 The municipal offices of Mayor and Vice Mayor become vacant on the happening of
6 any of the following events:**

7 (a) death of the incumbent;

**8 (b) declaration of mental incompetence by a final judgement or final order of a court
9 of competent jurisdiction;**

10 (c) resignation from office;

11 (d) refusal or failure to assume office;

12 (e) the decision of a competent tribunal declaring void his or her election;

13 (f) conviction of a felony, or of a crime involving moral turpitude;

14 (g) his or her change of residence from the municipality in which he or she was elected;

**15 (h) when an incumbent is incapacitated because of illness and unable to continue for
16 the remainder of the term to which he or she was elected;**

**17 (i) when an incumbent has sought and won election to another office and assumed the
18 new office, constituting voluntary relinquishment of the original office; or**

1 (j) if the results of a recall election, in accordance with §1121 of Chapter 1, Title 3,
2 Guam Code Annotated, are in favor of the removal of the incumbent.

3 The occurrence of any event under (a) through ~~(i)~~ (j), with respect to a person or persons
4 elected to office, after the election but before the term of office is to commence, constitutes a
5 vacancy on the date the term commences, unless the person or persons so elected is the
6 incumbent, in which case, the vacancy occurs on the date of such event.”

7 **Section 2.** A new § 13106.1 is hereby *added* to Chapter 13 of Title 3, Guam Code Annotated,
8 to read:

9 **“§ 13106.1 Temporary Vacancy.**

10 If there is a temporary vacancy greater than (30) days in the office of Mayor, caused
11 by other than official business, and there is no Vice Mayor, the vacancy shall be filled by the
12 Governor by appointment after soliciting the non-binding recommendations of the Municipal
13 Planning Council of the municipality.”

14 **Section 3.** §40110 of Article 1, Chapter 40, Division 4, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is
15 *amended* to read:

16 **“§ 40110. Permanent Vacancies.**

17 (a) Vice Mayors. A vacancy in the office of the Vice Mayor ~~less than two hundred~~
18 ~~forty (240) days before the date of the next general election for Mayors and Vice Mayors shall~~
19 ~~be filled for the unexpired term by *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* (The Governor) by appointment~~
20 ~~after soliciting the non-binding recommendations of a majority vote of the municipal planning~~
21 ~~council of the municipality in which the vacancy occurs, subject to the advice and consent of *I*~~
22 ~~*Liheslatura* (the Legislature).~~

23 (b) Mayors. *If* by reason of death, resignation, removal from office, inability or failure
24 to perform, there shall be a vacancy in the office of the Mayor, it shall be filled for the
25 unexpired term. ~~less than two hundred forty (240) days before the date of the next general~~
26 ~~election for Mayors and Vice Mayors, it shall be filled by the Vice Mayor in a municipality~~
27 ~~where there is a Vice Mayor, and there shall be a vacancy in the position of Vice Mayor until~~
28 ~~the end of the term. In a municipality where there is no Vice Mayor and the vacancy is less~~
29 ~~than 240 days before the date of the next general election for Mayors and Vice Mayors, the~~
30 ~~vacancy shall be filled by a majority vote of the Municipal Planning Council of the~~

1 ~~municipality in which the vacancy occurs, subject to the advice and consent of *I Liheslatura*~~
2 ~~(The Legislature).”~~ The vacancy shall be filled by *I Maga’hågan Guåhan* (the Governor) by
3 appointment after soliciting the non-binding recommendations of the Municipal Planning
4 Council of the municipality in which the vacancy occurred, subject to the advice and consent
5 of *I Liheslatura* (the Legislature), provided, however, that in a municipality where there is a
6 Vice -Mayor, the Vice-Mayor shall automatically assume the position of Mayor and there shall
7 be a vacancy in the position of Vice-Mayor.

8 **Section 4. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or
9 circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions
10 or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications,
11 and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.”
